## **CPI November 2019 - HIGHLIGHTS**

The overall Consumer Price Index (CPI) in November 2019 has decreased by 0.1 per cent year-on-year from 99.3 in November 2018 to 99.2 this year. Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages has recorded a decreased of 0.6 per cent, while Non-Food index increased by 0.04 per cent. Meanwhile, the Goods index has recorded a decrease of 0.7 per cent, while the Services index increased by 0.7 per cent.

On a monthly basis, the CPI has increased by 0.1 per cent compared to October 2019, whereby Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages and Non-Food recorded an increase of 0.05 per cent and 0.1 per cent, respectively.

For period-on-period, CPI for January to November 2019 registered a decrease of 0.5 per cent compared to the same period last year (Table 1).



# YEAR-ON-YEAR CHANGES (November 2019 compared to November 2018)

The CPI in November 2019 has decreased by 0.1 per cent compared to the same month in 2018.

Among the major groups which recorded decreases were the indices for Transport (4.0 per cent); Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels (1.6 per cent); and Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages (0.6 per cent) (Figure 1).

Figure 1: CPI Year-on-Year Changes, November 2019



Based on the contribution to change, Transport has contributed 921.0 per cent to the overall year-on-year decrease of the CPI in November 2019. This was followed by Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels (220.8 per cent); and Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages (135.6 per cent) (Table 2).

#### Decreases were recorded in:

- Transport (4.0 per cent) due to lower prices of purchase of the motor car, bicycles, spare parts and accessories of vehicles, lubricants and similar products as well as passenger transport by air;
- Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels (1.6 per cent) due to decrease prices of rentals for housing as well as materials for the maintenance and repair of the dwelling; and
- Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages (0.6 per cent) due to decrease prices of rice and cereals (3.6 per cent), fish and seafood (2.1 per cent), oil and fats (2.8 per cent), fruits (1.5 per cent) as well as sugar, jam, honey, chocolate and confectionery (0.4 per cent) (Table 3).

#### Increases were recorded in:

- Restaurants and Hotel (5.1 per cent) due to increase prices of selected food items in restaurants and cafés, other food services as well as contract catering;
- Furnishings, Household Equipment and Routine Household Maintenance (2.4 per cent) due to increase prices of household textiles, glassware, tableware and household utensils as well as nondurable household goods; and
- Recreation and Culture (1.9 per cent) due to increase prices of games, toys and hobbies, articles for pets, recreational and sporting services, books, magazines and periodical, stationery and drawing materials as well as package holidays/pilgrimages.



#### MONTH-ON-MONTH CHANGES (November 2019 compared to October 2019)

The CPI in November 2019 has increased by 0.1 per cent over October 2019.

The indices which recorded increases were Clothing and Footwear (1.8 per cent); Furnishings, Household Equipment and Routine Household Maintenance (0.8 per cent); and Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages (0.05 per cent) (Figure 2).

Based on the contribution to change, Clothing and Footwear has contributed 108.1 per cent to the overall month-on-month decrease of the CPI in November 2019. This was followed by Furnishings, Household Equipment and Routine Household Maintenance (89.1 per cent); and Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages (13.9 per cent) (Table 4).

#### Increases were recorded in:

- Clothing and Footwear (1.8 per cent) due to increase in prices of clothing material, garments, other articles of clothing and clothing accessories, tailoring charges and cleaning of clothing as well as shoes and other footwear.
- Furnishing, Household Equipment and Routine Household Maintenance (0.8 per cent) due to increase prices of household textiles, glassware, tableware and household utensils as well as small tools and miscellaneous accessories; and
- Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages (0.05 per cent) due to increase prices of milk, dairy products and eggs (0.7 per cent), oil and fats (0.5 per cent), vegetables (2.3 per cent), other food products (0.2 per cent) as well as coffee, tea and cocoa (0.2 per cent).

#### Decreases were recorded in:

- **Transport** (0.4 per cent) due to lower prices of passenger transport by air;
- Recreation and Culture (0.2 per cent) due to increase prices of audio-visual equipment, books as well as stationery and drawing materials; and
- Communication (0.1 per cent) due to increase prices of telephone and telefax equipment.

Meanwhile, the index for Education remain-unchanged.

#### PERIOD-ON-PERIOD CHANGES (January-November 2019 compared to January-November 2018)

The average CPI for the first eleven months (January to November) of 2019 has decreased by 0.5 per cent year-on-year compared to the same period in 2018 (Table 5).

Decreases were recorded in Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages (0.7 per cent); Clothing and Footwear (1.0 per cent); Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels (1.7 per cent); Furnishings, Household Equipment and Routine Household Maintenance (0.8 per cent); Transport (2.7 per cent); Communication (0.02 per cent); and Miscellaneous Goods and Services (0.3 per cent).

On the other hand, increases were recorded in Health (0.5 per cent); Recreation and Culture (2.1 per cent); Education (0.2 per cent); and Restaurants and Hotels (3.3 per cent).

### **Goods according to Durability and Services**

For November 2019, the indices for durables goods and non-durable goods have decreased year-on-year by 5.0 and 0.02 per cent, respectively. Meanwhile, the indices for semi-durable goods and services have increased by 2.4 and 0.7 per cent, respectively.

Compared to October 2019, the indices for durable goods and services have decreased by 0.2 and 0.1 per cent, respectively. Meanwhile, the indices for semi-durable goods as well as non-durable goods have increased by 1.6 and 0.03 per cent, respectively.

For the period January to November 2019, price of goods has decrease by 1.1 per cent while services recorded an increase of 0.5 per cent compared to the same period last year (Table 6).

#### **Consumer Price Index Technical Notes**

# 1. Concepts and Definitions

- 1.1 The Consumer Price Index (CPI) is a measure of the average change of prices paid by the household for a fixed 'basket' of goods and services over a period of time. The 'basket' of goods and services represents the average consumption pattern of the majority of households in Brunei Darussalam and it is derived from the results of a Household Expenditure Survey. The CPI is solely a measure of price changes and not a measure of changes in general cost of living.
- 1.2 As the CPI reflects the average changes in the prices of consumption goods and services, it is mainly used as a measurement of the rate of inflation. The CPI is also used as a deflator of other economic series such as the conversion of Gross Domestic Product (GDP) from current price values to constant price values.
- 1.3 The CPI basket covers a wide range of goods and services, classified according to the United Nation's "Classification of Individual Consumption According to Purpose (COICOP)". The goods and services are based on the final consumption expenditure of households. However, imputed rentals of owner-occupied housing and household expenditures abroad are excluded. Non-consumption expenditures such as donations, remittances, repayments of loans and purchase of real estate are also excluded.
- 1.4 The CPI can also be classified by the type of goods, according to their durability, and services, as follows:
  - **Durable goods**: Goods that are used repeatedly or continuously over a long period of time (e.g. furniture, household equipment, vehicles)
  - **Semi-durable goods**: Goods that are used repeatedly but their expected lifetime use is less than for durables and their purchaser's value is significantly less (e.g. clothing, footwear, glassware, games, toys, household textiles)
  - Non-durable goods: Goods that are for single use only (e.g. food and drink)
  - **Services**: Services such as education, health, personal services.
- 1.5 The base year is used as the reference year for computing the weights of the CPI basket based on the results of the Household Expenditure Survey (HES). However, for the computation of price relatives, the average prices of the current month are compared

with those of the previous month, instead of the average base year prices. The CPI calculation uses the chained index method, whereby the ratio of the average prices of the current month and the previous month is multiplied with the index value of the previous month.

# 2. Measurement of Changes in the CPI

- 2.1 The following changes are measured for the CPI:
  - **Year-on-year changes**: the percentage change between the current month and the same month in the previous year;
  - Month-on-month changes: the percentage change between the current month over the previous month; and
  - Period-on period changes: the percentage change between the average index of
    the year-to-date compared to the same period the previous year. For example,
    the average index from January to June of the current year is compared to the
    average index from January to June the previous year.
- 2.2 The **contribution to change** column provides information on which goods or services have contributed most to the changes in the index. It is calculated by multiplying the weight of a particular item or group of items with the monthly change in the index for this item or group of items.
- 2.3 The annual inflation rate is taken as the percentage changes between the annual index of the reference year and that of the previous year.

#### 3. Rounding Figures

3.1 The indices and percentage changes will be published to one decimal place in the CPI Reports. However, the computation of percentage changes and contribution to changes are based on the unrounded index values.

#### 4. Rebasing of CPI

The Consumer Price Index (CPI) for Brunei Darussalam has now been revised and rebased. The weights for the new CPI series were derived from the result of the Household Expenditure Survey 2015/16.
