## **DECEMBER 2020**

## **CPI December 2020 - HIGHLIGHTS**

The overall Consumer Price Index (CPI) in December 2020 has increased by 2.0 per cent year-on-year from 99.4 in December 2019 to 101.4 this year. Both Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages and Non-Food index have recorded an increase of 4.7 per cent and 1.4 per cent, respectively. Meanwhile, the Goods as well as Services index have increased by 1.9 per cent and 2.1 per cent, respectively.

On a month-on-month basis, the CPI has decreased by 0.1 per cent compared to November 2020. The Non-Food index has recorded a decrease of 0.4 per cent, while Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages index increased by 1.0 per cent.

For period-on-period, overall CPI in 2020 (January to December) registered an increase of 1.9 per cent compared to the same period in 2019. Both Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages and Non-Food index have recorded an increase of 2.5 per cent and 1.8 per cent, respectively (Table 1).



## YEAR-ON-YEAR CHANGES (December 2020 compared to December 2019)

The CPI in December 2020 has increased by 2.0 per cent compared to the same month in 2019.

Among the major groups which recorded increases were the indices for Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages (4.7 per cent); Miscellaneous Goods and Services (10.0 per cent); and Transport (3.3 per cent) (Figure 1).

Figure 1: CPI Year-on-Year Changes, December 2020



Based on the contribution to change, Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages has contributed 45.3 per cent to the overall year-on-year increase of the CPI in December 2020. This was followed by Miscellaneous Goods and Services (38.5 per cent); and Transport (30.8 per cent) (Table 2).

#### Increases were recorded in:

- Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages (4.7 per cent) due to increased prices of vegetables; meat as well as mineral waters, soft drinks, fruits and vegetable juices (Table 3);
- Miscellaneous Goods and Services (10.0 per cent) due to increased prices of insurance; other services as well as community and family services; and
- Transport (3.3 per cent) due to increased prices of motor car; passenger transport by air of a few limited scheduled flights as well as passenger transport by road.

### Decreases were recorded in:

- Clothing and Footwear (5.1 per cent) due to decreased prices of garments; clothing materials as well as shoes and other footwear;
- Furnishings, Household Equipment and Routine Household Maintenance (1.7 per cent) due to decreased prices of household textiles; major household appliances as well as non-durables household goods; and
- **Restaurants and Hotels** (0.7 per cent) due to decreased price of accommodation services.



## MONTH-ON-MONTH CHANGES (December 2020 compared to November 2020)

The CPI in December 2020 has decreased by 0.1 per cent over November 2020.

The indices which recorded decreases were Clothing and Footwear (6.8 per cent); Furnishings, Household Equipment and Routine Household Maintenance (1.2 per cent); and Miscellaneous Goods and Services (0.3 per cent) (Figure 2).

Based on the contribution to change, Clothing and Footwear has contributed 306.0 per cent to the overall monthon-month decrease of the CPI in December 2020. This was followed by Furnishings, Household Equipment and Routine Household Maintenance (97.8 per cent); and Miscellaneous Goods and Services (28.2 per cent) (Table 4).

## Decreases were recorded in:

- Clothing and Footwear (6.8 per cent) due to decreased prices of garments; clothing materials as well as shoes and other footwear;
- Furnishings, Household Equipment and Routine Household Maintenance (1.2 per cent) due to decreased prices of household textiles; non-durable household goods as well as furniture and furnishings; and
- Miscellaneous Goods and Services (0.3 per cent) due to decreased prices of other personal effects; other appliances articles and products for personal care as well as jewellery, clocks and watches.

### Increases were recorded in:

- Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages (1.0 per cent) due to increased prices of meat; vegetables as well as milk, dairy products and eggs;
- **Transport** (0.6 per cent) due to increased prices of passenger transport by air; and
- Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels (0.01 per cent) due to increased prices of materials for the maintenance and repairs of the dwelling.

Meanwhile, the indices for Communication and Education remain unchanged.

## **ANNUAL 2020**

## PERIOD-ON-PERIOD CHANGES (January-December 2020 compared to January-December 2019)

The average CPI for the twelve months (January to December) of 2020 has increased by 1.9 per cent compared to the same period in 2019 (Figure 3).

Based on the contribution to change, Miscellaneous Goods and Services has contributed 43.5 per cent to the overall increase of the CPI in 2020. This was followed by Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages (25.1 per cent); and Transport (11.4 per cent) (Table 5).

### Increases were recorded in:

- Miscellaneous Goods and Services (10.9 per cent) due to increased prices of insurance; other services as well as other personal effects;
- Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages (2.5 per cent) due to increased prices of vegetables; mineral waters, soft drinks, fruits and vegetable juices as well as meat (Table 6); and
- Transport (1.2 per cent) due to increased prices of passenger transport by air of a few limited scheduled flights; motor car as well as passenger transport by road.

## Decreases were recorded in:

Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels (0.3 per cent) due to decreased price of rentals for housing.

## **Goods according to Durability and Services**

For December 2020, the indices for durable goods, non-durable goods and services have increased year-on-year by 4.3, 2.4 and 2.1 per cent, respectively. Meanwhile, the index for semi-durable goods has decreased by 3.3 per cent year-on-year.

Compared to November 2020, the indices for durable goods and semi-durable goods have decreased by 0.04 and 4.6 per cent, respectively. Meanwhile, the indices for non-durable goods as well as services have increased by 0.5 and 0.2 per cent, respectively.

For the period January to December 2020, the indices of goods and services have increased by 1.4 and 2.7 per cent, respectively compared to the same period last year (Table 7).

#### **Consumer Price Index Technical Notes**

## 1. Concepts and Definitions

- 1.1 The Consumer Price Index (CPI) is a measure of the average change of prices paid by the household for a fixed 'basket' of goods and services over a period of time. The 'basket' of goods and services represents the average consumption pattern of the majority of households in Brunei Darussalam and it is derived from the results of a Household Expenditure Survey. The CPI is solely a measure of price changes and not a measure of changes in general cost of living.
- 1.2 As the CPI reflects the average changes in the prices of consumption goods and services, it is mainly used as a measurement of the rate of inflation. The CPI is also used as a deflator of other economic series such as the conversion of Gross Domestic Product (GDP) from current price values to constant price values.
- 1.3 The CPI basket covers a wide range of goods and services, classified according to the United Nation's "Classification of Individual Consumption According to Purpose (COICOP)". The goods and services are based on the final consumption expenditure of households. However, imputed rentals of owner-occupied housing and household expenditures abroad are excluded. Non-consumption expenditures such as donations, remittances, repayments of loans and purchase of real estate are also excluded.
- 1.4 The CPI can also be classified by the type of goods, according to their durability, and services, as follows:
  - **Durable goods**: Goods that are used repeatedly or continuously over a long period of time (e.g. furniture, household equipment, vehicles)
  - **Semi-durable goods**: Goods that are used repeatedly but their expected lifetime use is less than for durables and their purchaser's value is significantly less (e.g. clothing, footwear, glassware, games, toys, household textiles)
  - Non-durable goods: Goods that are for single use only (e.g. food and drink)
  - **Services**: Services such as education, health, personal services.
- 1.5 The base year is used as the reference year for computing the weights of the CPI basket based on the results of the Household Expenditure Survey (HES). However, for the computation of price relatives, the average prices of the current month are compared

with those of the previous month, instead of the average base year prices. The CPI calculation uses the chained index method, whereby the ratio of the average prices of the current month and the previous month is multiplied with the index value of the previous month.

## 2. Measurement of Changes in the CPI

- 2.1 The following changes are measured for the CPI:
  - **Year-on-year changes**: the percentage change between the current month and the same month in the previous year;
  - Month-on-month changes: the percentage change between the current month over the previous month; and
  - Period-on period changes: the percentage change between the average index of
    the year-to-date compared to the same period the previous year. For example,
    the average index from January to June of the current year is compared to the
    average index from January to June the previous year.
- 2.2 The **contribution to change** column provides information on which goods or services have contributed most to the changes in the index. It is calculated by multiplying the weight of a particular item or group of items with the monthly change in the index for this item or group of items.
- 2.3 The annual inflation rate is taken as the percentage changes between the annual index of the reference year and that of the previous year.

## 3. Rounding Figures

3.1 The indices and percentage changes will be published to one decimal place in the CPI Reports. However, the computation of percentage changes and contribution to changes are based on the unrounded index values.

## 4. Rebasing of CPI

The Consumer Price Index (CPI) for Brunei Darussalam has now been revised and rebased. The weights for the new CPI series were derived from the result of the Household Expenditure Survey 2015/16.
