HIGHLIGHTS

In February 2024, the overall Consumer Price Index (CPI) has decreased by 0.5 per cent year-on-year, from 106.8 in February 2023 to 106.2. The Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages index registered an increase of 1.3 per cent, while the Non-Food index decreased by 1.0 per cent. Meanwhile, the Goods index decreased by 1.0 per cent and the Services index increased by 0.1 per cent.

Compared to January 2024, the CPI has decreased by 0.1 per cent on a month-on-month basis. Both Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages index and Non-Food index recorded a decrease of 0.2 per cent and 0.1 per cent respectively.

Periodically, the CPI for January to February 2024 recorded a decrease of 0.2 per cent compared to the same period in 2023 (Table 1).

YEAR-ON-YEAR CHANGES (FEBRUARY 2024 COMPARED TO FEBRUARY 2023)

The CPI in February 2024 has decreased by 0.5 per cent compared to the same month in 2023.

Clothing and Footwear has contributed 99.7 per cent to the overall year-on-year decrease of the CPI in February 2024, followed by Communication 32.8 per cent; and Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels 22.9 per cent (Figure 1 and Table 2).

Decreases were recorded in:

- Clothing and Footwear 13.1 per cent due to decrease in prices of garments; clothing materials; and shoes and other footwear;
- Communication 3.1 per cent due to decrease in prices of telephone and telefax services; and telephone and telefax equipment; and
- Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels 1.1 per cent due to decrease in prices of services for the maintenance and repair of the dwelling; rentals for housing; and materials for the maintenance and repair of the dwelling.

Increases were recorded in:

- Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages 1.3 per cent due to increase in prices of mineral waters, soft drinks, fruit and vegetable juices; milk, dairy products and eggs; and rice and cereals (Table 3);
- Recreation and Culture 2.0 per cent due to increase in prices of package holidays/pilgrimages; pets and related products; and cultural services; and
- Restaurants and Hotels 0.8 per cent due to increase in price of restaurants, cafes, fast-food outlets and others.

CPI Year-on-Year Changes in February 2024



MONTH-ON-MONTH CHANGES (FEBRUARY 2024 COMPARED TO JANUARY 2024)

The CPI in February 2024 has decreased by 0.1 per cent from January 2024.

Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels has contributed 50.0 per cent to the overall month-on-month decrease of the CPI in February 2024, followed by Transport 45.7 per cent; and Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages 39.1 per cent (Figure 2 and Table 4).

Decreases were recorded in:

- Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels 0.6 per cent due to decrease in prices of services for the maintenance and repair of the dwelling; and materials for the maintenance and repair of the dwelling;
- Transport 0.3 per cent due to decrease in prices of passenger transport by air; and spare parts and accessories of vehicles; and
- Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages 0.2 per cent due to decrease in prices of vegetables; fish and seafood; and mineral waters, soft drinks, fruit and vegetable juices (Table 5).

Increases were recorded in:

- Furnishings, Household Equipment and Routine Household Maintenance 0.3 per cent due to increase in price of furniture and furnishings;
- Recreation and Culture 0.3 per cent due to increase in prices of cultural services; and package holidays/pilgrimages; and
- Miscellaneous Goods and Services 0.1 per cent due to increase in price of other appliances articles and products for personal care.

Meanwhile, the Restaurants and Hotels index remains unchanged.

PERIOD-ON-PERIOD CHANGES (JANUARY - FEBRUARY 2024 COMPARED TO JANUARY - FEBRUARY 2023)

The average CPI from January to February 2024 has decreased by 0.2 per cent year-on-year compared to the same period in 2023.

Clothing and Footwear has contributed 161.7 per cent to the overall period-on-period decrease of the CPI from January to February 2024. This was followed by Communication 81.1 per cent; and Transport 62.7 per cent (Table 6).

Decreases were recorded in:

- Clothing and Footwear 9.0 per cent due to decrease in prices of garments; clothing materials; and shoes and other footwear;
- Communication 3.1 per cent due to decrease in prices of telephone and telefax services; and telephone and telefax equipment; and
- **Transport** 0.7 per cent due to decrease in prices of motor cars; maintenance and repair of vehicles; bicycles.

Increases were recorded in:

- Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages 1.7 per cent due to increase in prices of mineral waters, soft drinks, fruit and vegetable juices; milk, dairy products and eggs; and rice and cereals;
- Recreation and Culture 2.3 per cent due to increase in prices of package holidays/pilgrimages; cultural services and pets and related products; and
- Restaurants and Hotels 0.7 per cent due to increase in price of restaurants, cafes, fast-food outlets and others.

GOODS ACCORDING TO DURABILITY AND SERVICES

For February 2024, the Goods index decreased by 1.0 per cent, while the Services index increased by 0.1 per cent. The decrease in Goods was contributed by semi-durable and durable goods.

Meanwhile, compared to January 2024, the Goods index and Services index recorded a decrease of 0.1 per cent and 0.2 per cent respectively.

For the period January to February 2024, the Goods index registered a decrease of 0.5 per cent, while the Services index increased by 0.1 per cent, compared to the same period in 2023 (Table 7).

Consumer Price Index Technical Notes

1. Concepts and Definitions

- 1.1 The Consumer Price Index (CPI) is a measure of the average change of prices paid by the household for a fixed 'basket' of goods and services over a period of time. The 'basket' of goods and services represents the average consumption pattern of the majority of households in Brunei Darussalam and it is derived from the results of a Household Expenditure Survey. The CPI is solely a measure of price changes and not a measure of changes in general cost of living.
- 1.2 As the CPI reflects the average changes in the prices of consumption goods and services, it is mainly used as a measurement of the rate of inflation. The CPI is also used as a deflator of other economic series such as the conversion of Gross Domestic Product (GDP) from current price values to constant price values.
- 1.3 The CPI basket covers a wide range of goods and services, classified according to the United Nation's "Classification of Individual Consumption According to Purpose (COICOP)". The goods and services are based on the final consumption expenditure of households. However, imputed rentals of owner-occupied housing and household expenditures abroad are excluded. Non-consumption expenditures such as donations, remittances, repayments of loans and purchase of real estate are also excluded.
- 1.4 The CPI can also be classified by the type of goods, according to their durability, and services, as follows:
 - **Durable goods**: Goods that are used repeatedly or continuously over a long period of time (e.g. furniture, household equipment, vehicles)
 - **Semi-durable goods**: Goods that are used repeatedly but their expected lifetime use is less than for durables and their purchaser's value is significantly less (e.g. clothing, footwear, glassware, games, toys, household textiles)
 - Non-durable goods: Goods that are for single use only (e.g. food and drink)
 - Services: Services such as education, health, personal services.
- 1.5 The base year is used as the reference year for computing the weights of the CPI basket based on the results of the Household Expenditure Survey (HES). However, for the computation of price relatives, the average prices of the current month are compared with those of the previous month, instead of the average base year prices. The CPI calculation uses the chained index method, whereby the ratio of the average prices of the current month and the previous month is multiplied with the index value of the previous month.

2. Measurement of Changes in the CPI

- 2.1 The following changes are measured for the CPI:
 - **Year-on-year changes**: the percentage change between the current month and the same month in the previous year;
 - Month-on-month changes: the percentage change between the current month over the previous month; and
 - Period-on period changes: the percentage change between the average index of
 the year-to-date compared to the same period the previous year. For example,
 the average index from January to June of the current year is compared to the
 average index from January to June the previous year.
- 2.2 The **contribution to change** column provides information on which goods or services have contributed most to the changes in the index. It is calculated by multiplying the weight of a particular item or group of items with the monthly change in the index for this item or group of items.
- 2.3 The annual inflation rate is taken as the percentage changes between the annual index of the reference year and that of the previous year.

3. Rounding Figures

3.1 The indices and percentage changes will be published to one decimal place in the CPI Report while significantly small non-zero digits will be published to one significant figure. However, the computation of percentage changes and contribution to changes are based on the unrounded index values.

4. Base Year of CPI

4.1 The CPI was rebased using data from the Household Expenditure Survey (HES) to reflect the latest consumption patterns of goods and services by households. The latest base year for the CPI was in 2015.
