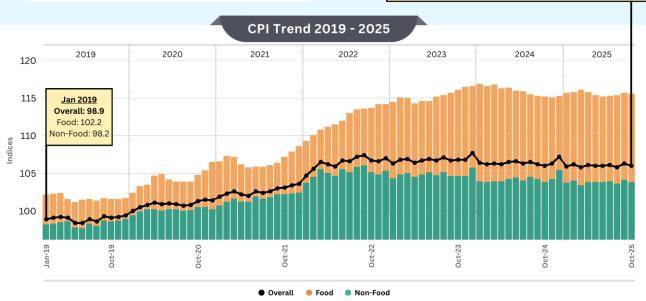

Notes

- CPI measures the average change of prices of a fixed basket of goods and services paid by households in a certain period of time.
- Year-on-year means to compare prices with the same month in the previous year.
- Month-on-month means to compare prices with the previous month.

HIGHLIGHTS

In October 2025, the overall Consumer Price Index (CPI) has increased by 0.1 per cent year-on-year, from 106.0 in October 2024 to 106.1. The Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages index and the Non-Food index increased by 0.4 per cent and 0.03 per cent respectively. Meanwhile, the Goods index recorded an increase of 0.4 per cent, while the Services index decreased by 0.3 per cent.

Compared to September 2025, the CPI has **decreased** by 0.2 per cent on a month-on-month basis. Both Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages index and the Non-Food index declined by 0.1 per cent and 0.3 per cent respectively.

Periodically, the CPI for January to October 2025 recorded a decrease of 0.3 per cent compared to the same period in 2024 (Table 1).

YEAR-ON-YEAR CHANGES (OCTOBER 2025 COMPARED TO OCTOBER 2024)

The CPI in October 2025 has increased by 0.1 per cent compared to the same month in 2024.

Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages have contributed 75.7 per cent to the overall year-on-year increase of the CPI in October 2025, followed by Clothing and Footwear 69.8 per cent; and Transport 57.1 per cent (Figure 1; Table 2).

Increases were recorded in:

- Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages 0.4 per cent due to an increase in prices of fruits; fish and seafood; and coffee, tea and cocoa (Table 3);
- Clothing and Footwear 1.9 per cent due to an increase in prices of garments; and other articles of clothing and clothing accessories; and shoes and other footwear; and
- Transport 0.3 per cent due to an increase in prices of passenger transport by air; motor cars; and spare parts and accessories of vehicles.

Decreases were recorded in:

- Miscellaneous Goods and Services 1.1 per cent due to a decrease in prices of insurance; other services; and other appliances articles and products for personal care;
- Furnishings, Household Equipment and Routine Household Maintenance 0.4 per cent due to a decrease in prices of household textiles; major household appliances whether electric or not; and glassware, tableware and household utensils; and
- Recreation and Culture 0.4 per cent due to a decrease in prices of package holidays/pilgrimages; cultural services; and pets and related products.

CPI Year-on-Year Changes in October 2025

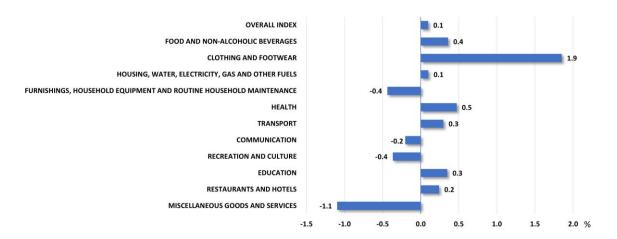

MONTH-ON-MONTH CHANGES (OCTOBER 2025 COMPARED TO SEPTEMBER 2025)

The CPI in October 2025 has decreased by 0.2 per cent from September 2025.

Transport has contributed 49.6 per cent to the overall month-on-month decrease of the CPI in October 2025, followed by Clothing and Footwear 47.9 per cent; and Recreation and Culture 15.3 per cent (Figure 2; Table 4).

Decreases were recorded in:

- **Transport** 0.6 per cent due to a decrease in price of passenger transport by air;
- Clothing and Footwear 2.7 per cent due to a decrease in price of clothing materials; and
- Recreation and Culture 0.5 per cent due to a decrease in price of package holidays/pilgrimages.

Increases were recorded in:

- Miscellaneous Goods and Services 0.2 per cent due to an increase in prices of jewellery, clocks and watches; insurance; and other personal effects;
- Furnishings, Household Equipment and Routine Household Maintenance 0.2 per cent due to an increase in prices of furniture and furnishings; non-durable household goods; and major household appliances whether electric or not; and
- Restaurants and Hotels 0.04 per cent due to an increase in price of restaurants, cafes, fast-food outlets and others.

Meanwhile, Communication, Education, Health, and Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels indices remain unchanged.

PERIOD-ON-PERIOD CHANGES (JANUARY - OCTOBER 2025 COMPARED TO JANUARY - OCTOBER 2024)

The average CPI from January to October 2025 has decreased by 0.3 per cent year-on-year compared to the same period in 2024.

Transport has contributed 50.3 per cent to the overall period-on-period decrease of the CPI from January to October 2025. This was followed by Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages 29.2 per cent; and Recreation and Culture 20.6 per cent (Table 6).

Decreases were recorded in:

- **Transport** 0.8 per cent due to a decrease in prices of passenger transport by air; and motor cars;
- Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages 0.4 per cent due to a decrease in prices of meat; milk, dairy products and eggs; and fish and seafood; and
- Recreation and Culture 0.9 per cent due to a decrease in prices of cultural services; games, toys and hobbies; and package holidays/pilgrimages.

Increases were recorded in:

- Clothing and Footwear 1.1 per cent due to an increase in prices of clothing materials; garments; other articles of clothing and clothing accessories;
- Restaurants and Hotels 0.3 per cent due to an increase in price of restaurants, cafes, fast-food outlets and others; and
- Education 0.3 per cent due to an increase in prices of pre-primary and primary education; and tertiary education.

GOODS ACCORDING TO DURABILITY AND SERVICES

For October 2025, the Goods index recorded an increase of 0.4 per cent, while the Services index decreased by 0.3 per cent. The increase in Goods was contributed by durable, semi-durable and non-durable goods.

Meanwhile, compared to September 2025, the Goods index and the Services index decreased by 0.1 per cent and 0.3 per cent.

For the period from January to October 2025, the Goods index and Services index declined by 0.2 per cent and 0.4 per cent respectively, compared to the same period in 2024 (Table 7).

Consumer Price Index Technical Notes

1. Concepts and Definitions

- 1.1 The Consumer Price Index (CPI) is a measure of the average change of prices paid by the household for a fixed 'basket' of goods and services over a period of time. The 'basket' of goods and services represents the average consumption pattern of the majority of households in Brunei Darussalam and it is derived from the results of a Household Expenditure Survey. The CPI is solely a measure of price changes and not a measure of changes in general cost of living.
- 1.2 As the CPI reflects the average changes in the prices of consumption goods and services, it is mainly used as a measurement of the rate of inflation. The CPI is also used as a deflator of other economic series such as the conversion of Gross Domestic Product (GDP) from current price values to constant price values.
- 1.3 The CPI basket covers a wide range of goods and services, classified according to the United Nation's "Classification of Individual Consumption According to Purpose (COICOP)". The goods and services are based on the final consumption expenditure of households. However, imputed rentals of owner-occupied housing and household expenditures abroad are excluded. Non-consumption expenditures such as donations, remittances, repayments of loans and purchase of real estate are also excluded.
- 1.4 The CPI can also be classified by the type of goods, according to their durability, and services, as follows:
 - **Durable goods**: Goods that are used repeatedly or continuously over a long period of time (e.g. furniture, household equipment, vehicles)
 - **Semi-durable goods**: Goods that are used repeatedly but their expected lifetime use is less than for durables and their purchaser's value is significantly less (e.g. clothing, footwear, glassware, games, toys, household textiles)
 - Non-durable goods: Goods that are for single use only (e.g. food and drink)
 - Services: Services such as education, health, personal services.
- 1.5 The base year is used as the reference year for computing the weights of the CPI basket based on the results of the Household Expenditure Survey (HES). However, for the computation of price relatives, the average prices of the current month are compared with those of the previous month, instead of the average base year prices. The CPI calculation uses the chained index method, whereby the ratio of the average prices of the current month and the previous month is multiplied with the index value of the previous month.

2. Measurement of Changes in the CPI

- 2.1 The following changes are measured for the CPI:
 - **Year-on-year changes**: the percentage change between the current month and the same month in the previous year;
 - Month-on-month changes: the percentage change between the current month over the previous month; and
 - Period-on period changes: the percentage change between the average index of
 the year-to-date compared to the same period the previous year. For example,
 the average index from January to June of the current year is compared to the
 average index from January to June the previous year.
- 2.2 The **contribution to change** column provides information on which goods or services have contributed most to the changes in the index. It is calculated by multiplying the weight of a particular item or group of items with the monthly change in the index for this item or group of items.
- 2.3 The annual inflation rate is taken as the percentage changes between the annual index of the reference year and that of the previous year.

3. Rounding Figures

3.1 The indices and percentage changes will be published to one decimal place in the CPI Report while significantly small non-zero digits will be published to one significant figure. However, the computation of percentage changes and contribution to changes are based on the unrounded index values.

4. Base Year of CPI

4.1 The CPI was rebased using data from the Household Expenditure Survey (HES) to reflect the latest consumption patterns of goods and services by households. The latest base year for the CPI was in 2015.
