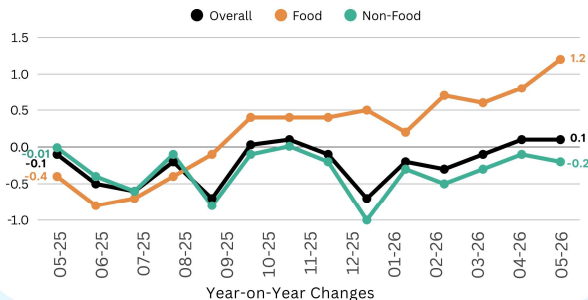

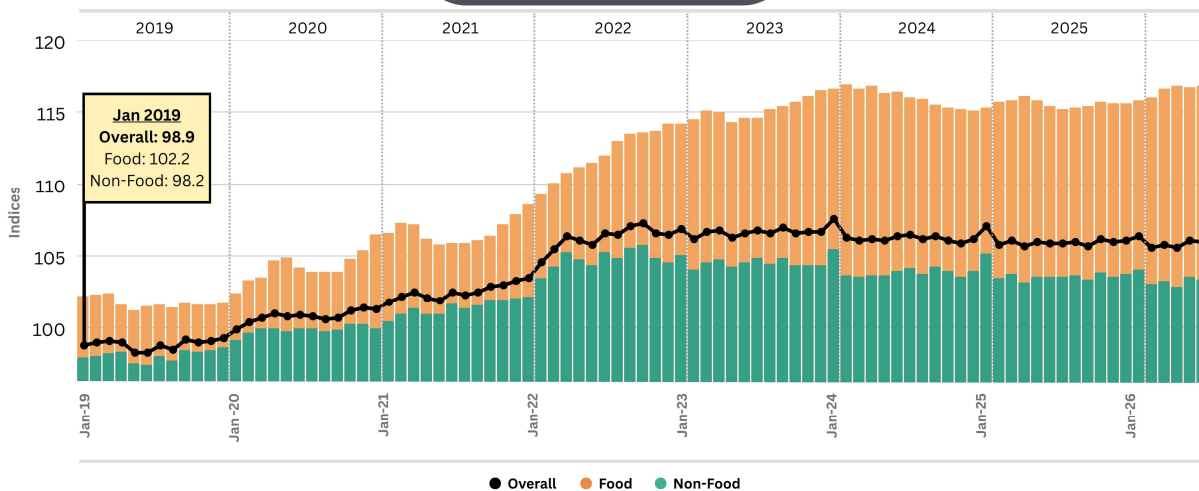

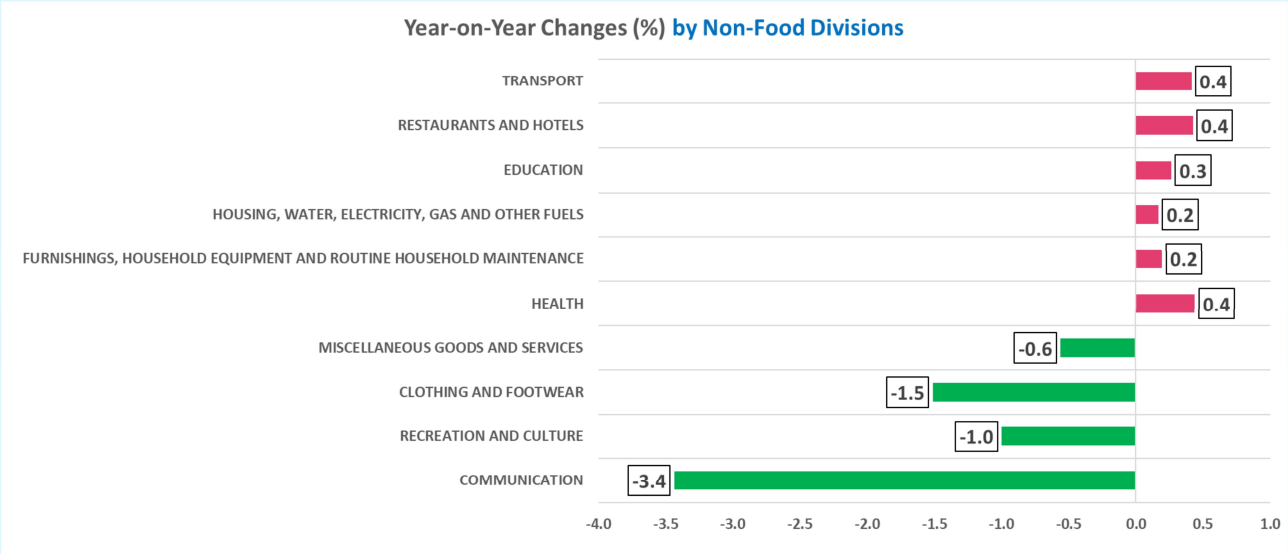

## HIGHLIGHTS

In May 2026, the overall Consumer Price Index (CPI) has **increased** by 0.1 per cent year-on-year, from 106.0 in May 2025 to 106.1. This was contributed by an increase of 1.2 per cent in the Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages index, while the Non-Food index registered a decrease of 0.2 per cent. Meanwhile, the Goods index increased by 0.2 per cent, while the Services index decreased by 0.2 per cent.

Compared to April 2026, the CPI has **decreased** by 0.1 per cent on a month-on-month basis, contributed by a decrease of 0.2 per cent in the Non-Food index. Meanwhile, the Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages index increased by 0.1 per cent.

Periodically, the CPI for January to May 2026 recorded an overall decrease of 0.1 per cent compared to the same period in 2025 (**Table 1**).

## YEAR-ON-YEAR CHANGES (MAY 2026 COMPARED TO MAY 2025)

The CPI in May 2026 has increased by 0.1 per cent compared to the same month in 2025.

Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages have contributed 354.0 per cent to the overall year-on-year increase of the CPI in May 2026, followed by Transport 110.6 per cent; and Restaurants and Hotels 68.3 per cent (**Figure 1** and **Table 2**).

Increases were recorded in:

- **Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages** 0.6 per cent due to fish and seafood; meat; and fruits (**Table 3**);
- **Transport** 0.4 per cent due to passenger transport by air; motor cars; and motorcycles; and
- **Restaurants and Hotels** 0.4 per cent due to restaurants, cafes, fast-food outlets and others; and accommodation services.

Decreases were recorded in:

- **Communication** 3.4 per cent due to telephone and telefax services; and telephone and telefax equipment;
- **Recreation and Culture** 1.0 per cent due to package holidays/pilgrimages; cultural services; and recreational and sporting services; and
- **Clothing and Footwear** 1.5 per cent due to garments; and clothing materials.

Figure 1: CPI Year-on-Year Changes, May 2026

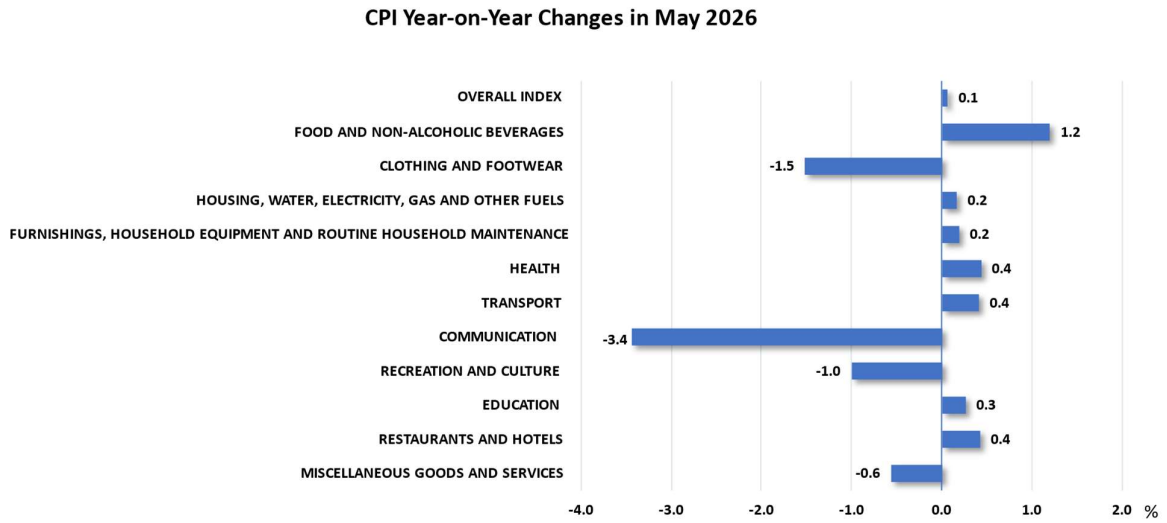

**MONTH-ON-MONTH CHANGES (MAY 2026 COMPARED TO APRIL 2026)**

The CPI in May 2026 has decreased by 0.1 per cent from April 2026.

Clothing and Footwear has contributed 81.7 per cent to the overall month-on-month decrease of the CPI in May 2026, followed by Transport 66.1 per cent; and Recreation and Culture 13.6 per cent (**Figure 2** and **Table 4**).

Decreases were recorded in:

- **Clothing and Footwear** 3.0 per cent due to clothing materials; and garments;
- **Transport** 0.5 per cent due to passenger transport by air; and
- **Recreation and Culture** 0.3 per cent due to package holidays/pilgrimages; recreational and sporting services; and games, toys and hobbies.

Increases were recorded in:

- **Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels** 0.5 per cent due to rentals for housing;
- **Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages** 0.1 per cent due to fruits; rice and cereals; and meat (**Table 5**); and
- **Miscellaneous Goods and Services** 0.1 per cent due to other appliances articles and products for personal care; other personal effects; and insurance.

Meanwhile, the Communication; and Education indices remained unchanged.

**Figure 2: CPI Month-on-Month Changes, May 2026**

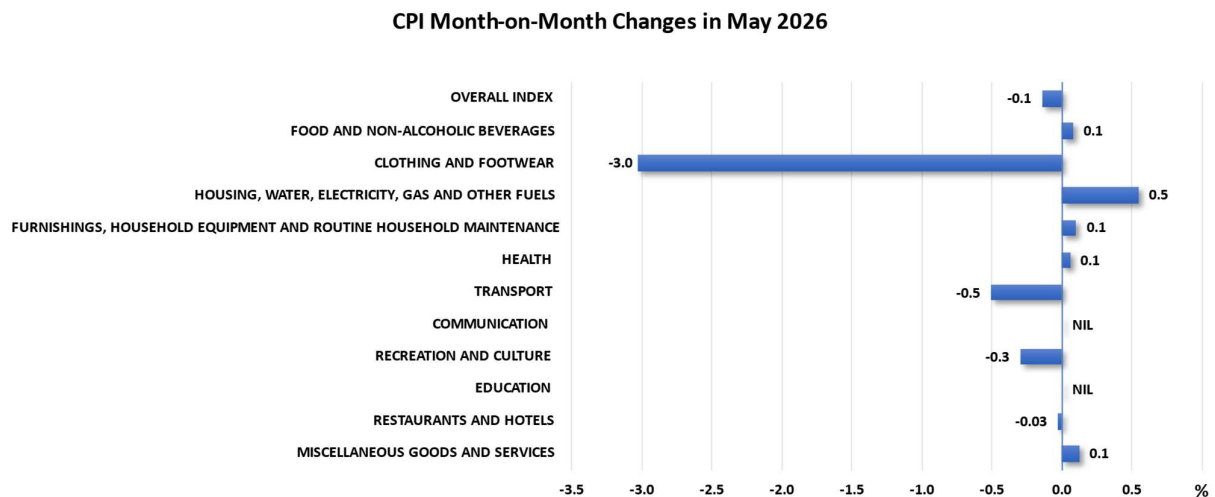

**PERIOD-ON-PERIOD CHANGES (JANUARY - MAY 2026 COMPARED TO JANUARY - MAY 2025)**

The average CPI from January to May 2026 has decreased by 0.1 per cent year-on-year compared to the same period in 2025.

Communication has contributed 210.3 per cent to the overall period-on-period decrease of the CPI from January to May 2026. This was followed by Recreation and Culture 143.9 per cent; and Miscellaneous Goods and Services 36.7 per cent (**Table 6**).

Decreases were recorded in:

- **Communication** 3.5 per cent due to telephone and telefax services; and telephone and telefax equipment;
- **Recreation and Culture** 1.9 per cent due to cultural services; package holidays/pilgrimages; and pets and related products; and
- **Miscellaneous Goods and Services** 0.3 per cent due to insurance; and hairdressing salons and personal grooming establishments.

Increases were recorded in:

- **Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages** 0.7 per cent due to fish and seafood; meat; and fruits;
- **Restaurants and Hotels** 0.5 per cent due to restaurants, cafes, fast-food outlets and others; and accommodation services; and
- **Clothing and Footwear** 0.7 per cent due to shoes and other footwear; garments; and clothing materials.

**GOODS ACCORDING TO DURABILITY AND SERVICES**

For May 2026, the Goods index increased by 0.4 per cent, while the Services index recorded a decrease of 0.4 per cent. The increase in Goods was contributed by durable and non-durable goods.

Meanwhile, compared to April 2026, the Goods index and the Services index decreased by 0.1 per cent and 0.2 per cent respectively.

For the period from January to May 2026, the Goods index registered an increase of 0.3 per cent, while the Services index decreased by 0.6 per cent, compared to the same period in 2025 (**Table 7**).
