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Foreword

It is with great pleasure to disseminate and communicate the results of the Household Expenditure Survey (HES) 2015/16 which was conducted by The Department of Economic Planning and Development (JPKE). The HES 2015/16 was undertaken over a one-year period from 1st April 2015 until 31 March 2016 and it was the sixth such survey being conducted in Brunei Darussalam.

The main objectives of HES 2015/16 were to collect up-to-date and comprehensive information on the pattern of household expenditure and the level of household income, to revise the lists and weightings of goods and services of the Consumer Price Index (CPI); and to provide additional information for national accounts and social statistics purposes.

This Report of Household Expenditure Survey 2015/16 contains tables on the patterns and distributions of the general households' expenditure of Brunei Darussalam in 2015/16 as well as the composition of the average monthly household expenditure by socio-economic status of heads of household. Furthermore, tabulations on household income and its sources are also included. A brief summary of survey findings is also presented.

I hope that the report will provide useful information and meet the need of planners, policy makers, researchers and various users' needs.

I would like to place my sincere appreciation to the HES 2015/16 team for their efforts towards the successful completion of the HES 2015/16 and to all participating households throughout the country for their supports and cooperation in providing valuable information.

Executive Summary

Introduction

The Department of Economic Planning and Development (JPKE) conducted the **Household Expenditure Survey (HES) 2015/16** starting from 1st April 2015 until 31st March 2016. HES 2015/16 was the sixth such survey being conducted in Brunei Darussalam. The main objectives of HES 2015/16 were:

- ➤ To collect up-to-date and comprehensive information on the pattern of household expenditure and the level of household income;
- To revise the lists and weightings of goods and services of the Consumer Price Index (CPI); and
- ➤ To provide additional information for national accounts and social statistics purposes.

Household Expenditure

The data and analysis presented in this report mostly relate to the consumption expenditure of households. Household consumption expenditure refers to all expenditures, whether in cash or in-kind, by the household and individual members on goods and services, intended for consumption. It also includes the value of goods and services produced by the household for own consumption. Thus, the imputed rent of owner-occupied housing is included as part of household consumption expenditure. Non-consumption expenditures such as repayment of loans, deposits with banks and purchase of properties are excluded.

During the survey period 2015/16, a household in Brunei Darussalam spent an average of BND 2,923 per month on household consumption. This represented an increase of 0.2 per cent per year from BND 2,895 per month in 2010/11.

Meanwhile, the median monthly household expenditure in 2015/16 was BND 2,205 compared to BND 2,241 in 2010/11. This indicates that half of the households in Brunei Darussalam spent less than BND 2,205 per month and the other half spent more than BND 2,205.

Households in urban areas had higher average and median monthly household expenditure compared to those in the rural areas throughout the years from 2005 to 2015/16. Among the districts, Tutong District recorded the highest in both average and median monthly household expenditure at BND 3,073 and BND 2,436 respectively.

Household Expenditure by Type of Goods and Services

The expenditure pattern in 2015/16 showed that the expenditure groups of housing, water, electricity, gas and other fuels; transport; and food and non-alcoholic beverages accounted for around 60 per cent of the average monthly household expenditure. The expenditure on housing, water, electricity, gas and other fuels was the highest at about BND 988 per month, representing about 33.8 per cent of the average monthly household expenditure. This was followed by expenditure on transport at BND 379 per month (13.0 per cent) and food and non-alcoholic beverages at BND 364 per month (12.5 per cent).

The household spending on education recorded the highest increase of 18.3 per cent per year in a period of five years from BND 79 per month in 2010/11 to BND 183 in 2015/16; while spending on furnishing, household equipment, and routine household maintenance recorded the highest decrease of 9.4 per cent per year from BND 223 per month in 2010/11 to BND 136 per month in 2015/16.

Household Expenditure by Income Groups

Household income affects the composition and patterns of a household's monthly expenditure. The households can be categorised by income quintile groups, each consisting 20 per cent of the households.

It can be observed that household expenditure increases with household income. In 2015/16, households in the first (bottom) quintile reported an average expenditure of BND 1,429 per month, while the fifth (top) quintile spent BND 4,925 per month, about three times more than that spent by households in the bottom quintile. The median household expenditure for the bottom and top quintiles were BND 1,315 and BND 3,775 respectively.

By types of goods and services, the largest share of the monthly household expenditure across all income quintiles was on Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels, ranging from a share of 26.1 per cent for the top quintile to 48.3 per cent for the bottom quintile. Expenditure on food constituted the second largest share of the monthly spending by households in the first, second and third quintiles. The second highest spending of households in the fourth and fifth quintiles was on transport, both at 14.5 per cent.

In terms of per capita expenditure, the average for the bottom quintile was BND 321 per month and BND 614 for the top quintile. The national average per capita expenditure was about BND 472 per month compared to BND 457 per month in 2010/11.

Household Income

Household income consists of regular receipts, both in cash and in-kind, accruing to members of the household before compulsory deductions. It is made up of income from work, self-employment income, property income and transfer income. The monthly household income refers to the average income received per month by all household members from all sources. Household income also includes the imputed rent of owner-occupied housing.

The distribution of households by monthly income classes shows a shift towards higher household income over the years from 2010/11 to 2015/16. The proportion of households earning less than BND 2,000 per month decreased from 12.7 per cent in 2010/11 to 9.7 per cent in 2015/16; while proportions of households earning BND 6,000 and more in monthly income recorded increases, with those in the BND 10,000 and above income class increasing in proportion from 12.8 per cent in 2010/11 to 18.9 per cent in 2015/16.

In this instance, the median is considered better than the average (mean) as an indicator of a typical level of household income, because it is less affected by changes taking place at the lower and upper extremes of the distribution. The median is a more stable and robust measure and is not susceptible to outliers or extreme values.

In 2015/16, the median household income was BND 5,611 per month, indicating that half of all households in Brunei Darussalam earned an income of less than BND 5,611 per month while the other half received more than BND 5,611 per month. This represented an increase of 4.2 per cent per year from BND 4,576 in 2010/11.

Meanwhile, the average monthly household income in Brunei Darussalam in 2015/16 increased by 4.3 per cent per year to BND 7,009 from BND 5,670 in 2010/11.

Among the districts, Brunei Muara District recorded the highest in both average and median monthly household income at BND 7,271 and BND 5,877 respectively.

Household Income by Sources

In terms of the composition of household income, the average (mean) remains the most frequently used measure of income level since the different income components will sum up to the total income.

By income sources, paid employment, which includes employer and employee income, remained the largest portion of the average monthly household income at about BND 4,953 in 2015/16, compared to BND 4,392 in 2010/11. However, its share of the total household income decreased to 70.7 per cent in 2015/16 from 77.5 per cent in 2010/11.

Self-employment income, including income of family workers, accounted for 5.8 per cent, an increase from only 2.5 per cent in 2010/11. Meanwhile, property income, mainly from the imputed rent of owner-occupied housing, and transfer income contributed 12.5 per cent (BND 878) and 11.0 per cent (BND 770) respectively.

Household Income by Income Groups

In 2015/16, the median monthly income of households the first quintile group increased to BND 2,012 from BND 1,897 in 2010/11. Households in the other quintile groups also experienced increases in their median monthly income compared to in 2010/11. Similarly, the average household monthly income showed an increasing trend across all quintile groups.

The major source of income in all the quintile groups was employment income, followed by property income, transfer income, and self-employment income. For households in the first quintile, employment income accounted for 43.5 per cent of their monthly household income. This share increased to 73.1 per cent for the fifth quintile households.

The opposite trend was observed for property and transfer income, where the first quintile households had higher shares (at 28.3 per cent and 22.6 per cent respectively) compared to the fifth quintile households (at 9.7 per cent and 8.5 per cent respectively).

In terms of per capita monthly income, the average for the bottom quintile was BND 426 per month and BND 1,963 for the top quintile. The national average per capita income increased to BND 1,131 in 2015/16 from BND 895 in 2010/11.

Ownership of Housing and Household Durables

The increase in household income between 2005 and 2015/16 has subsequently led to an increase in expenditure, including for the ownership of housing, motor vehicles, and household durables. Availability of consumer durables serves as an indicator of the households' access to modern-day conveniences and standard of living.

The proportion of households with owner-occupied housing surged to 83.6 per cent (56,811 households) in 2015/16 from 72.7 per cent (48,010 households) in 2010/11, representing an increase in home ownership by 3.4 per cent per year.

The proportion of households that owned motor vehicles increased from 95.8 per cent (63,215 households) in 2010/11 to 97.0 per cent (65,922 households) in 2015/16.

In 2015/16, almost all households owned a television (99.2 per cent), refrigerator (98.8 per cent), gas stove (97.9 per cent), washing machine (97.2 per cent), and airconditioner (96.2 per cent).

Ownership and access to telecommunication equipment and services also increased with mobile phones ownership at 98.3 per cent, computers (78.1 per cent), and internet access (48.8 per cent). Cable television subscriptions, however, decreased to 79.0 per cent in 2015/16 from 81.6 per cent in 2010/11.








HOUSEHOLD EXPENDITURE 2015/16



Average and Median Monthly Household Expenditure By Expenditure Class and Year




Average Monthly Household Expenditure and Share by Types of Goods and Services














HOUSEHOLD INCOME 2015/16

SURVEY FINDINGS

Chapter 1: Household Expenditure

1.1 Introduction

In the Household Expenditure Survey (HES), household expenditure data refers to consumption expenditure incurred by households, whether in cash or in-kind. It is the value of consumer goods and services acquired, used or paid for by a household and its individual members for the satisfaction of the needs and wants. It also includes the value of goods and services produced by the household for their own consumption. Thus, the imputed rent of owner-occupied housing is included as a part of household consumption expenditure.

The household consumption expenditure is categorized according to the Classification of Individual Consumption According to Purpose (COICOP), including an additional category for consumption expenditure abroad.

Non-consumption expenditure such as repayment of car, housing, personal, and other loans; repayment of credit card bills; deposits with banks; and purchase of properties are excluded.

1.2 Monthly Household Expenditure

During the survey period 2015/16, a household in Brunei Darussalam spent an average of BND 2,923 per month on household consumption expenditure. This represented an increase of 0.7 per cent per year from BND 2,735 per month in 2005 (Table 1.1).

The median monthly household expenditure in 2015/16 was BND 2,205, compared to BND 2,075 in 2005 (**Table 1.2**). This indicates that half of the households in Brunei Darussalam spent less than BND 2,205 per month and the other half spent more than BND 2,205.

Households in urban areas had higher average and median monthly household expenditure compared to those in the rural areas throughout the years from 2005 to 2015/16. On average, households in urban areas spent about BND 3,000 per month, which was 11 per cent higher than their rural counterparts at BND 2,695 per month (Figure 1.1). However, the gap in the average and median monthly household expenditures between the urban and rural areas were getting smaller as well. Furthermore, households in both urban and rural areas experienced increases in their monthly expenditure at 0.4 per cent and 1.5 per cent per year respectively between 2005 and 2015/16.

In 2015/16, the average monthly household expenditure in the urban areas was about a quarter more than the median expenditure, while in the rural areas, average expenditure was about one fifth more than the median expenditure. This suggests that wealthier households were spending relatively more than the average household. Hence, the median expenditure appears more representative of the average expenditure of households considering the uneven spending behaviour of households.

In 2015/16, Tutong recorded the highest among all districts in average monthly household expenditure and median monthly household expenditure at BND 3,073 and BND 2,436 per month respectively. In contrast, Temburong was found to have the lowest average monthly household expenditure and median monthly household expenditure at BND 1,763 per month and BND 1,475 per month respectively.


Across all districts, Tutong has the highest growth in average monthly household expenditure at 2.4 per cent per year from 2005 until 2015/16. This is followed by Belait at 0.9 per cent per year and Brunei Muara at 0.2 per cent per year. Temburong, on the other hand, experienced negative growth in household expenditure at -1.1 per cent per year.

1.3 Monthly Per Capita Expenditure

The average household size estimated from the survey was 6.2 persons in 2015/16, compared to 6.3 persons in 2010/11 and 5.8 persons in 2005. Hence, in terms of expenditure per capita, the national average was about BND 472 per month in 2015/16 compared to BND 473 in 2005 (Table 1.3 and Figure 1.3).


Average Monthly Per Capita Expenditure by Urban/Rural, 2005, 2010/11, and 2015/16, Brunei Darussalam



Average Monthly Per Capita Expenditure by Districts, 2005, 2010/11, and 2015/16, Brunei Darussalam


Between the years 2005 and 2015/16, the average monthly per capita expenditure among the rural households recorded a relatively higher increase (15.4 per cent per annum) than the urban households (2.7 per cent per annum). Thus, this indicates that the cost of living in rural areas had risen over the years from 2005 to 2015/16.

Meanwhile, there was a decline in average monthly per capita expenditure among households in Brunei Muara and Temburong between the years 2005 and 2015/16, while households in Belait and Tutong experienced an increase in their average monthly per capita expenditures. In 2015/16, it was observed that households in Tutong had the highest average monthly expenditure (BND 2,436) and the highest average monthly per capita expenditure (BND 515) amongst all districts. In contrast, households in Temburong was observed to have the lowest average monthly expenditure (BND 1,475) and the lowest average monthly per capita expenditure (BND 317) among all districts in 2015/16 (Figure 1.4).

1.4 Monthly Household Expenditure by Monthly Income Class

The distribution of households by monthly expenditure class shows that the highest proportion of households in 2005, 2010/11 and 2015/16 was in the range of BND 1,000 – 1,999, at 29.9 per cent, 32.5 per cent and 37.1 per cent of households respectively. Meanwhile, the proportion of households that spent less than BND 1,000 per month dropped from 18.0 per cent in 2005 to only 6.5 per cent in 2015/16 (Table 1.4 and Figure 1.5). About 60 per cent of the households have a monthly expenditure between BND 1,000 and BND 2,999 per month in 2015/16.


1.5 Monthly Household Expenditure by Income Decile Groups

Household income affects the composition and patterns of a household's monthly expenditure. To analyse the expenditure patterns of households categorized by their income groups, the households are ranked in ascending order according to their incomes and then divided into ten equal groups. Each group, first decile which comprises 10 per cent of the households with the lowest income, while the tenth decile consists of households with the highest income.

Table 1.5 shows the average monthly household expenditure by income decile groups. As would be expected, household expenditure increases with household income. Households in the first decile (lowest 10 per cent of households by income) had seen an increase in their monthly expenditure from BND 671 in 2005 to BND 1,287 in 2015/16, while the tenth decile households (highest 10 per cent of households) experienced decrease in spending from BND 6,367 a month in 2005 to BND 5,331 in 2015/16. Meanwhile, 80% of the households had their monthly expenditure ranging from BND 1,287 to BND 5,331.

The average household expenditures across all income deciles were higher in 2015/16 than in 2005, except for the tenth income decile. Households in the first income decile recorded the highest increase in their monthly expenditure at 6.7 per cent per year, while households in the tenth income decile experienced the highest annual decrease of 1.8 per cent.



1.6 Monthly Household Expenditure by Household Size

The level of monthly household expenditure also varied according to the size of the household. As the household becomes bigger, the monthly expenditure becomes higher. Larger households, though, enjoy the benefits of sharing cost of common facilities such as housing rental and utilities (Figure 1.7). A household of six members, for example, spent BND 3,024 per month which equals to BND 504 per person, compared to a one-person household that spent an average of BND 1,361 per month in 2015/16 (Table 1.6).

1.7 Monthly Household Expenditure by Type of Goods and Services

The expenditure pattern of households in Brunei Darussalam in 2015/16 showed that the expenditure groups of housing, water, electricity, gas and other fuels; transport; and food and non-alcoholic beverages accounted for around 60 per cent of the average monthly household expenditure. The expenditure on housing, water, electricity, gas and other fuels was the highest at BND 988 per month, representing about 33.8 per cent of the average monthly household expenditure. This was followed by expenditure on transport at BND 379 (13.0 per cent); and food and non-alcoholic beverages at BND 364 per month (12.5 per cent) (Table 1.7).

The household spending on restaurants and hotels recorded the highest increase of 7.2 per cent per year in a period of ten years from BND 144 per month in 2005 to BND 290 in 2015/16; while spending on furnishing, household equipment and routine household maintenance recorded the highest decrease of 4.1 per cent per year from BND 206 per month in 2005 to BND 136 in 2015/16.


Figure 1.8 Average Annual Change of Monthly Household Expenditure by Type of Goods and Services, 2005, 2010/11, and 2015/16, Brunei Darussalam ■ Furnishings, Household Equipment and Routine Household Maintenance



1.7.1 Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels

The expenditure on housing, water, electricity, gas and other fuels at about BND 988 per month, accounted for the highest share (33.8 per cent) of the monthly household expenditure in 2015/16 (Figure 1.9 and Figure 1.10). This was also the case in 2005 and 2010/11; however, the monthly spending and the share were lower at BND 874 (32.0 per cent) and BND 968 (33.4 per cent) respectively.

The increase was mainly due to the increase in the average imputed rentals of owner-occupied housing from BND 376 in 2005 to BND 622 in 2015/16 (**Table 1.8**). Further analysis showed that the number of households with owner-occupied housing has increased from 36,810 households (61.5%) in 2005 to 56,811 households (82.4%) in 2015/16 (**Table 1.9 and Figure 1.11**).

The number of households who paid actual rentals, either to the landlords or the employers, decreased from 12,678 in 2005 to 10,136 in 2010/11. However, the average monthly expenditure on actual housing rentals increased slightly from BND 60 in 2005 to BND 65 in 2010/11.

In 2015/16, households in Brunei Darussalam also recorded increases in their spending on other actual rentals, services for the maintenance and repair of the dwelling, water supply and electricity compared to 2005.



1.7.2 Transport

The household expenditure on transport decreased from BND 450 in 2005 to BND 379 in 2015/16 (**Table 1.10**). This was mainly due to the decline in maintenance and repair of vehicles by 14.1 per cent per year from BND 43 in 2005 to BND 9 in 2015/16. Spending and other services in respect of vehicles, however, increased from BND 9 to BND 13 (**Figure 1.12**).



1.7.3 Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages

The monthly household expenditure on food and non-alcoholic beverages decreased by 0.5 per cent per year from BND 383 in 2005 to BND 364 in 2015/16. Almost all of the shares of expenditure by the food sub-groups were lower in 2015/16 than 2005, although spending on some sub-groups increased while others decreased. The highest increase in food expenditure (3.0 per cent per year) was on food products n.e.c. while the highest decrease (3.3. per cent per year) was spending on fish and seafood. The average monthly expenditure on non-alcoholic beverages was BND 47, compared to BND 39 in 2005, an increase of 1.8 per cent per year (Table 1.11).

It is interesting to note here that while spending on food and non-alcoholic beverages (mostly consumed at home) decreased by 0.8 per cent per year between 2005 and 2015/16, household expenditure on restaurants, on the other hand, which included food away from home and catering services, increased by 7.0 per cent annually from BND 143 in 2005 to BND 281 in 2015/16.

1.8 Monthly Household Expenditure by Income Quintiles and Types of Goods and Services

Instead of decile groups, the households can also be grouped into income quintile groups. The households are divided into five equal groups in ascending order of their income and each quintile consists of 20 per cent of the households. In 2015/16, households in the top quintile spent BND 4,925 per month on average, which is more than three times higher compared to the average spent by the households in the bottom quintile. In 2005, the top quintile households spent almost six times more than the bottom quintile households (**Table 1.12**).

The proportions spent on the various types of goods and services by each of the quintile income groups are shown in **Table 1.12**. It is observed that the largest share of the monthly household expenditure across all income quintiles was on Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels throughout 2005 until 2015/16.

In 2015/16, expenditure on transport constituted the third largest share of the monthly spending by households in the first, second and third quintiles. On the other hand, households in the fourth and fifth quintiles have their expenditure on transport ranked the second largest share of their monthly spending.

The relative proportion spent on food by each of the five quintile income groups shows an interesting pattern. The highest proportion was spent by the first quintile (16.8 per cent) and this proportion decreased as income level rose, to 13.5 per cent for the third quintile and 12.0 per cent for the fifth quintile (Figure 1.13). The reverse pattern, however, was observed for expenditure on recreation and culture; miscellaneous goods and services; and consumption expenditure abroad where the proportions increased as income level rose. This is consistent with the general observation that with rising affluence, the tendency is to spend more on luxuries rather than basic essentials like food.



Distribution (%) of Monthly Household Expenditure by Type of Goods and Services, 2005, 2010/11, and 2015/16, Brunei Darussalam



Chapter 2: Household Income

2.1 Introduction

Household income consists of regular receipts, both in cash and in-kind, accruing to members of the household before compulsory deductions. It is made up of income from work, self-employment income, property income, transfer income and other income. The monthly household income refers to the average income received per month by all household members from all sources. Household income also includes the imputed rent of owner-occupied housing. However, the income of the domestic workers or maids is excluded from the total household income.

2.2 Monthly Household Income

The average monthly household income in Brunei Darussalam in 2015/16 increased by 4.2 per cent per year to BND 7,009 from BND 4,661 in 2005 (**Table 2.1**). The median monthly household income in 2015/16 was BND 5,611 compared to BND 3,640 in 2005, indicating that half of all households in Brunei Darussalam earned an income of less than BND 5,611 per month, while the other half received more than BND 5,611 (**Table 2.2**).

Between the years 2005 and 2015/16, households in both urban and rural areas recorded increases in their average and median household income, with urban households generally earning higher household income than their rural counterparts. In 2015/16, the average monthly household income in the urban areas was BND 7,297, a 4.1 per cent annual growth from BND 4,868 in 2005. On the other hand, households in the rural areas earned an average of BND 6,157 per month compared to BND 4,075 in 2005, representing annual growth of 4.2 per cent per year.



Across districts, it is observed that households in Brunei Muara district earned the highest monthly average and median monthly household income in 2015/16 at BND 7,271 and BND 5,877 per month respectively. On the other hand, Temburong had the lowest monthly average and median monthly household income in 2015/16 at BND 4,015 and BND 2,929 respectively. In terms of annual growth of average monthly household income, Belait experienced the fastest at 5.9 per cent per annum among all districts in 2015/16. This is followed by Brunei Muara and Tutong, both at 4.1 per cent per annum. Meanwhile, Temburong experienced the slowest growth at 1.6 per cent per annum in 2015/16.

2.3 Monthly Per Capita Income

The monthly per capita income in Brunei Darussalam in 2015/16 was BND 1,131, representing an increase of 3.4 per cent per year from BND 807 in 2005 (Table 2.3 and Figure 2.3). Households in the urban areas were found to have higher per capita income compared to their rural counterparts across all the years from 2005 to 2015/16. In 2015/16, the per capita income of urban households was BND 1,172 per month compared to those of rural households at BND 1,005 per month.

In 2015/16, Belait was reported to have the highest per capita income among all districts at BND 1,308 per month. This is followed by Brunei Muara at BND 1,128 per month, Tutong at BND 1,032 per month and Temburong at BND 721 per month (Figure 2.4). In terms of annual growth, Belait experienced the fastest annual per capita income growth among all districts at 5.0 per cent per year from 2005 to 2015/16. Tutong followed suit at 4.0 per cent per year, while Brunei Muara was at 3.0 per cent per year. Temburong, on the other hand, saw the slowest annual per capita income growth at 1.3 per cent per year (Table 2.3).



Average Monthly Per Capita Income by Districts, 2005, 2010/11, and 2015/16, Brunei Darussalam


2.4 Monthly Household Income by Monthly Income Class

The distribution of households by monthly expenditure class shows a shift towards higher household income over the years from 2005 to 2015/16 (Table 2.4). The proportion of households earning less than BND 1,000 per month decreased from 8.4 per cent in 2005 to 2.1 per cent in 2015/16. Furthermore, there was a decrease in the proportions of households in the BND 1,000 - 1,999, BND 2,000 - 2,999, and BND 3,000 - 3,999 income classes. Proportions of households in the BND 4,000 - 4,999 and above recorded increases, with those in the income class of BND 10,000 and above having more than doubled in proportion from 7.2 per cent in 2005 to 18.9 per cent in 2015/16.

Distribution of Households by Monthly Income Class, 2005, 2010/11, and 2015/16, Brunei Darussalam




2.5 Monthly Household Income by Income Decile Groups

In 2015/16, households in all income decile groups experienced increases in their monthly household income compared to in 2005. The first decile households received an average monthly income of BND 1,347 compared to BND 604 in 2005, while the tenth decile households earned an average income of BND 20,209 per month, compared to BND 13,514 per month in 2005.

Moreover, the difference in the average household income between the top and bottom decile groups had also decreased. In 2015/16, the top decile households earned a monthly income of 15 times more than the bottom decile households; whereas in 2005, their average monthly income was almost 22 times higher than that of the bottom decile households (Table 2.5).



2.6 Monthly Household Income by Household Size

In **Table 2.6**, it can be observed that bigger sized households had higher average monthly household income. A household of six members, for example, earned on average BND 7,096 per month in 2015/16, compared to BND 4,006 for a household of only two members. This is because bigger households would have more persons earning income, thus increasing their total monthly household income. The average monthly household incomes across all household sizes were higher in 2015/16 compared to in 2005.


2.7 Monthly Household Income by Income Source

Out of the average monthly household income of BND 7,009 in 2015/16, 70.7 per cent (BND 4,953) was derived from paid employment, which included employer and employee income, whether full-time or part-time. In contrast, paid employment made up 77.5 per cent (BND 4,392) of household income in 2010/11. Self-employment income, including income of family workers, accounted for 5.8 percent in 2015/16, doubling from 2.5 per cent in 2010/11. Property income, mainly from the imputed rent of owner-occupied housing, contributed 12.5 per cent of household income in 2015/16 compared to 10.9 per cent in 2010/11. On the other hand, transfer income made up 11.0 per cent of the household income in 2015/16 compared to only 9.1 per cent in 2010/11 (Table 2.7).

2.8 Household Savings

The HES provides information about both the income and the expenditure of households, but it would be misleading to regard the difference between the household income and expenditure as savings. Savings is defined as that part of income not immediately spent or consumed but reserved for future consumption, investment or for unforeseen contingencies.

The two key datasets that are used in estimating household savings are household disposable income and household consumption expenditures on goods and services:

- Household disposable income comprises the current income of the households sector from production plus property and transfer receipts (such as interest, dividends, and social benefits) minus payments (such as transfer and interest payments); and
- Household final consumption expenditures on goods and services.

Household savings is estimated by subtracting household consumption expenditure from household disposable income. While a more comprehensive measure of household savings is compiled in the household sector accounts of the national accounts, the HES data can be used to provide an estimate of average monthly household savings.

The average monthly household disposable income in 2015/16 was estimated at BND 6,959, after deducting transfer payments from the monthly household income. Household savings were then derived at BND 4,036 per household per month, an increase from BND 2,710 in 2010/11 (Table 2.9).

It was also found that 20.8 per cent (BND 840 on average) of the household savings was spent on repayments of loans for housing, car and other household durables ownership in 2015/16. In contrast, this figure was 36.0 per cent (BND 975 on average) in 2010/11.

Household savings generally increased from the first to the tenth income decile households. The second income decile households saved an average of BND 865 per month, while the fifth and tenth decile households saved BND 2,505 and BND 14,792 respectively.

Chapter 3: Ownership of Housing and Household Durables

3.1 Introduction

The increase in household income between 2005 and 2015/16 has subsequently led to an increase in expenditure, including for the ownership of housing, motor vehicles and household durables. Data on availability of consumer durables also serve as a proxy indicator of the households' access to modern-day conveniences and standard of living.

Household durables are goods purchased that are meant for long-term use and are intended to sustain daily or regular usage for several years before replacement of such goods is required, including motor vehicles and household appliances.

3.2 Home Ownership

The proportion of households with owner-occupied housing surged to 83.6 per cent (56,811 households) in 2015/16 from 61.5 per cent (36,810 households) in 2005, representing an increase in home ownership by 4.4 per cent per year **(Table 3.1)**.

The proportion of households with home ownership also increased across all income quintiles. In the first quintile, the proportion of home ownership increased from 58.7 per cent in 2005 to 79.0 per cent in 2015/16. Also, the proportion of households with home ownership was higher in the second quintile than in third and fourth quintiles in 2015/16.

The imputed rent of owner-occupied housing is included in both household income and household consumption expenditure. The imputed rents accounted for 8.9 per cent of household income and 21.3 per cent of household consumption expenditure in 2015/16. If the imputed rental value (BND 622) is excluded, the household income and household consumption expenditure in 2015/16 would be BND 6,387 and BND 2,301 respectively.

3.3 Motor Vehicles

The proportion of households that owned motor vehicles increased from 93.2 per cent (55,806 households) in 2005 to 97.0 per cent (65,922 households) in 2015/16 (Table 3.2). This represented an average annual increase of 1.7 per cent.


Motor vehicle ownership rates were generally very high among households in all income quintiles, reflecting the necessity for households to own a car for their daily transportation to work and sending the children to school.

3.4 Household Appliances

In 2015/16, almost all households owned a television (99.2 per cent), refrigerator (98.8 per cent), gas stove (97.9 per cent), washing machine (97.2 per cent), and airconditioner (96.2 per cent) (**Figure 3.1**). Moreover, the proportions of households with these appliances had increased between the years 2005 and 2015/16.

Ownership of electric stoves among households declined to 16.8 per cent in 2015/16 from 51.8 per cent in 2005. This could be an indication of increased awareness among households to save on the usage of electricity.




3.5 Telecommunication Equipment and Services

The affordability, popularity, and convenience of mobile phones had led to the increase of mobile phone ownership by 2.2 per cent per year between 2005 and 2015/16. In terms of proportion, households with mobile phones reached nearly 99% in 2015/16 (Figure 3.2).

The proportion of households with cable television subscriptions increased from 63.2 per cent in 2005 to 81.6 per cent in 2010/11 and fell to 79.0 per cent in 2015/16. Ownership of computers among households also increased from 57.7 per cent in 2005 to 78.1 per cent in 2015/16. Furthermore, there was a bigger proportion of households owning laptop computers compared to desktop computers in 2015/16.

With more households owning computers in 2015/16, the proportion of households with internet subscriptions at home also increased. In 2015/16, nearly half (48.8 per cent) of households had internet subscription at home, up from one quarter (25.0 per cent) of households in 2005.



TECHNICAL NOTES

Survey Methodology and Data Quality

4.1 Introduction

The Department of Economic Planning and Development (JPKE) conducted the **Household Expenditure Survey (HES) 2015/16** starting from 1st April 2015 until 31st March 2016. HES 2015/16 was the sixth such survey being conducted in Brunei Darussalam. The main objectives of the HES 2015/16 were:

- To collect up-to-date and comprehensive information on the pattern of household expenditure and the level of household income;
- To revise the lists and weightings of goods and services of the Consumer Price Index (CPI); and
- To provide additional information for national accounts purposes.

4.2 Scope and Coverage

The coverage of the HES 2015/16 was nationwide on a sample basis limited to private households with urban and rural dimensions. It excluded the institutional population permanently residing in houses such as hostels, correctional establishments, and military camps. Persons living in seasonal dwellings and workers living at their work-sites were also not covered.

The scope of the survey excluded some of the remote rural villages where field operation was difficult. However, these very small villages were marginal in number and on top of that, all dwelled households and their members in these remote villages were included in the population estimates to which the HES 2015/16 estimates were adjusted. For selected housing units, all households that were cooperative during the survey period were enumerated.

4.3 Sample Design

The survey has a two-stage stratified sample design. At the first stage of sampling, a sample of geographical units, called sub-segments, is drawn within each stratum with probabilities proportional to size, where size is measured in terms of the total number of households according to the Population and Housing Census 2011. Each sub-segment contained around 60 to 80 housing units, depending on the distances between the housing units. The selected sub-segments were then divided into 12 sub-samples, where each sub-sample was surveyed for one survey month. The reasons to spread over the twelve-month period were:

- To ensure seasonal variation in particular months with festive activities were taken into account,
- To enhance data quality, and
- To ensure good control of the supervision of fieldwork operations.

At the second stage of sampling, a fixed number of sample households are drawn in each sample sub-segment with equal probabilities by systematic random sampling. While the sampling frame for the first stage came from the list of sub-segments in the Population and Housing Census 2011, the second stage, however, required a fresh listing of households through fieldwork enumeration. This is done to update the selected segments with new housing units and household formations, demolished or vacant buildings, and dwellings transformed into non-residential buildings. This fresh listing thusly ensures that every household currently residing in the sample segments has a non-zero probability of selection. The listing of housing units in the sampled sub-segments was carried out on every quarter during the survey year. In each quarter, housing units in sub-segments allocated for the next three months were listed by a dedicated team tasked specifically for enumeration.

Sample size determination is based on the principle of calculating the required sample size for a single 'domain' first while assuming a simple random sample design with zero non-response. A domain is a well-defined population group for which estimates with predetermined accuracy are sought. The results are then extended to allow for non-response and deviation from simple random sampling. Hence, the required sample size per domain is determined by the following formulae:

The z statistic used is 1.96 for the 95 per cent level of confidence, which is the standard for assigning the degree of confidence desired in measuring the margin of error in household surveys according to international guidelines. σ^2_r is the variance of the main indicator of the survey r, which for this survey is the mean monthly household consumption expenditure obtained from the previous Household Expenditure Survey, i.e., HES 2010/11. The design effect, D, is evaluated to be 1.95 based on the previous HES data.

The variable ρ , which is the estimated response rate of the survey, was introduced in order to offset the reduction in data quality caused by non-response and is set at 70.0 per cent. The parameter η is the average household size, and its value is set at 5.8 based from the Population and Housing Census 2011. Since there is no specific target population in this survey, thus the proportion of the total population accounted for by the target population, represented by the variable p, is set to 1.0. For the margin of error ε , the level of precision was set at about 7.0 per cent of the key indicator. Furthermore, the factor finite multiplier was also taken into account in the sample size calculation.

To ensure that the sample is adequately spread over the major geographical regions as well as the urban and rural areas of the country, the sample was thusly stratified into eight strata consisting of the four administrative districts, each sub-divided into the urban and rural parts. The essential elements of the HES 2015/16 sample design and sample response (effective final sample size) are summarized in **Table 4.1** below.

The effective design sample size is less four households from that of design sample size due to a few sampled sub-segments having less than 18 households, i.e., the sample-take. The final list frame used for the HES 2015/16 consisted of 1,750 sub-segments for the whole country, of which 1,322 of them were in urban areas and 428 in the rural areas. Selection from the sampling frame was done by the Ordered Systematic Sampling method, whereby 94 sub-segments were selected from the urban areas and 66 sub-segments from the rural areas.

There were in total 2,371 households with completed interviews, covering 14,462 household members of whom 7,047 were male, and 7,415 were female. The response rate of the survey was 79.1 per cent, which is above the predicted response rate of the survey (70.0 per cent) used in the design of the survey, thus ensuring that the level of margin of error in the key indicator household expenditure is not compromised.

4.4 Estimation Procedures

To obtain the estimates of population aggregates, the sample results were extrapolated using sampling weights. The initial sampling weights were calculated on the basis of the sample design and response rates. The sample design determines the probability of selection of each unit that, in principle, is a known non-zero value between 0 and 1.

In mathematical terms, the initial weights are given by:

The initial weights were then firstly adjusted to non-response:

Subsequently, the weights $(w_2)_i$ were further adjusted by extrapolating the weights to the total number of households in 2016. The total households were estimated via annual household growth projection. This ensures that the weights add up to the total number of households in 2015/16 based on data from initial estimation.

The adjusted weights were then calibrated to conform to benchmark data for 2016 obtained from population projections by sex. Calibration means the calculation of calibrated weights such that the application of these weights to the auxiliary variables will give estimates exactly equal to the known population totals on those auxiliary variables.

In general, suppose that associated to each population element k in the finite population U, there exists a vector of J auxiliary variables x_k , with values $x_k = \left(x_{k_1}, \dots, x_{k_j}, \dots, x_{k_l}\right)$. The corresponding population total is then given by the known vector

Applying the extrapolation weights w_k to the values of the auxiliary variables in sample S gives

which may differ from the known population values t_x .

The weights were calibrated by minimizing the expected average distance between the adjusted weights and the original weights. Thus, in this case, the calibrated weights W_i are given by:

and the corresponding totals vector \mathbf{t}_x were set with the projected male and female population in 2016, while the totals vector $\mathbf{t}_{x\pi}$ were set with the estimated male and female population, derived from the product between the weights w_3 and the sample population.

4.5 Data Collection Method

The HES 2015/16 was conducted by a combination of the interview and 'diary' methods. During the initial interview with the respondent, the survey officers would record information about the living quarters, the household, and its members in the Household Questionnaire. Meanwhile, data on expenditures and incomes received were recorded on a daily basis, either by the survey officers or the respondents themselves, using a Household Record Book (HRB). The daily recording of household transactions has the advantage of reducing the effect of memory bias. For events that do not occur very frequently, for example, the purchase of household durables such as household appliances and travels outside the country, the reference period was one year to capture the seasonality of the household expenditure.

The Household Questionnaire contains seven sections as follows:

On the other hand, the Household Record Book (HRB) contains seven schedules as follows:

4.6 Data Processing

Manual editing of the completed questionnaires and HRBs was done by the survey officers during the collection of data from the households for every survey month. The entries made by the responding households were examined, especially the reconciliation table of expenditures and receipts. The survey officer would ask the household to explain for any large differences. Then the accomplished schedules were transmitted to their chief supervisor in the district, who in turn, performed general screening of the schedules for completeness and correctness of entries made either by the survey officer or the responding household.

The accomplished HRBs were then submitted to the office to undergo the stages of data processing from batching, editing, coding, data entry and verification before final tabulation of the results.

4.7 Data Quality

Like in all sample surveys, the results of the HES 2015/16 were subjected to sampling and different forms of measurement errors. The sources of these survey errors include sampling errors, coverage errors, non-response errors, response errors and other errors such as coding and data entry errors. Details of each error type will be discussed thoroughly in the following sections.

4.7.1 Sampling Errors

Sampling errors arise because the survey covers the elements of a selected portion of the population rather than the entire population. The sampling error of an estimate is based on the difference between the estimate, and the value that would have been obtained had a complete count of the whole population was taken under identical conditions. In mathematical terms, the sampling error is obtained by taking the square root of the sampling variance, which for complex multi-stage sampling design, is given by:

Information on sampling errors can be used to assess the precision of the estimates and the degree of confidence that may be attached to them. Also, it allows decisions on the degree of detail with which the survey data may be meaningfully tabulated and analysed. Furthermore, information on sampling errors can be used to evaluate the statistical significance of time series estimates and estimates of differences between multiple population subgroups.

Additionally, information on sampling errors may be used for the evaluation and improvement of sample designs and procedures. Rational decisions on the choice of sample size, sample allocation among strata, clustering, and estimation procedures can only be made when their effects on the magnitude of sampling errors in the resulting statistics obtained from the survey are known in detail. **Table 4.2** gives the sampling errors of the main HES 2015/16 indicators.

To illustrate the application of the table above, it can be stated that the value for average monthly household expenditure, which is BND 2,923, is estimated with a relative standard error of 2.1 per cent. Furthermore, the true value of the average monthly household expenditure, at 95 per cent confidence level, lies within the interval BND 2,809 and BND 3,037, calculated as follows:

$$2,923 - 1.96 \times 58 \le X \le 2,923 + 1.96 \times 58$$

 $2,809 \le X \le 3,037$

where X is the true value of the average monthly household expenditure, while the constant 1.96 is derived from the inverse of the standard normal cumulative distribution with the corresponding probability of 95 per cent.

The precision requirement set for the average monthly household expenditure in the survey design was 6.9 per cent margin of error (ME) relative to the previous average monthly household expenditure, corresponding to a standard error of about 3.5 per cent. In terms of order of magnitude, this value is in line with the achieved standard error of the average monthly household expenditure, which is 2.0 per cent as shown in **Table 4.2**.

4.7.2 Coverage Errors

Probability sampling requires each element in the target population to have a known non-zero probability of being selected in the sample. This condition is violated if the target population is not fully represented in the sample frame or if the sample selection of units from the frame is not according to the procedures specified in the sample design. The violation of these conditions thusly generates coverage errors.

Coverage errors occur when there are imperfections in the sampling frame (undercoverage, over-coverage, or duplication of units), or due to practical problems such as confusion in the boundary of units or rules of association between units of different types. In addition, failure in recognising some eligible persons, such as lodgers, domestic workers, or other non-family members dwelling in the household may lead to coverage errors as well.

In HES 2015/16, one of the measures taken to reduce coverage error was by updating the sample frame, obtained from the Population and Housing Census 2011, regularly. Housing areas developed after the census in 2011, such as the National Housing Scheme Meragang and National Housing Scheme Tanah Jambu, were incorporated into the sampling frame. Other measures such as fresh listings of households in sampled segments also contributed towards minimizing the coverage error in the survey.

4.7.3 Non-Response Errors

Non-response refers to the failure to obtain responses from some of the sample units. The occurrence of non-response errors can be due to failure in obtaining the required information from the units selected in the sample (unit non-response), or due to failure in obtaining some items of information for the selected unit (item non-response). Unit non-response may occur due to incorrect address of the sample household, or inaccessibility of certain dwellings, or refusal of the selected household to participate in the survey, or because failure to find respondents at home.

In practice, it is implausible to eliminate non-response errors completely. However, various steps were taken to minimize non-response error, ranging from increasing sample size by factoring estimated non-response to good persuasion techniques and making repeated visits to households with members who are often absent from the residence.

Non-response errors can be measured by counting the number of sampled households that failed to participate in the survey (Table 4.3). Households that were categorised as non-response include those with absent members, refusals, vacant and demolished housing units, out-of-scope (such as dwelling units turned into stores or workshops), and other reasons that lead to the void of target households (such as living quarters used as secondary housing units and were rarely dwelled in).

Based on **Table 4.3**, the non-response rate of the survey is calculated by:

$$NRR = \frac{NR}{R + NR} \times 100$$

The non-response rate (20.7 per cent) is slightly lower than the anticipated non-response rate (25.0 per cent) used in the design of the survey. In the calculation of the sampling weights, the design weights were adjusted for non-response.

4.7.4 Other Errors

Other sources of errors in a survey include data processing errors, which is comprised of editing, coding and data entry errors. One measure of data processing error is to evaluate the assignment of codes by data entry operators when classifying the types of goods and services for the household consumption expenditure recorded in the survey. The household consumption expenditures are categorised according to the Brunei Darussalam Classification of Individual Consumption by Purpose (BDCOICOP) 2015.

Table 4.4 shows that 43,374 records were assigned with codes that classify the expenditures as "others", for instance, "Other rice" and "Other articles of clothing". This indicates that the expenditure described by the respondent could not be precisely found in the BDCOICOP 2015 at the item-level, and therefore had to be coded as "others" within the appropriate higher grouping of the classification.

Another aspect of BDCOICOP 2015 is the diversity of the codes at the item level. From Table 5.3, the BDCOICOP 2015 has 1,648 distinct item-level codes. A total of 1,550 item-level codes were assigned by data entry operators to classify the goods and services recorded in the survey, indicating satisfactory performance in expenditure classification.

Overall, the analysis shows that the survey results enjoy sufficient precision and acceptable quality. The standard error of the household expenditure at 2.0 per cent was well below the margin error at 6.9 per cent, while the overall non-response rate was at 20.7 per cent, slightly below the 25 per cent non-response rate threshold designed for the survey.

Concepts and Definitions

The concepts and definitions used in the Household Expenditure Survey 2015/16 are as follows:

Compounded Annual Growth Rate (CAGR)

The compounded annual growth rates between two distinct years are calculated based on the following exponential function:

District

Brunei Darussalam is divided into four districts namely Brunei Muara, Belait, Tutong and Temburong.

Economic Activity Status

The economic activity refers to the status of activity of the person during the survey month, whether economically active or otherwise. Economically active persons are those who are either working or actively seeking for a job (unemployed). The economically inactive persons are those who are neither working nor unemployed, and includes housewives, pensioners, and students.

Head of Household

The head of household is the person generally acknowledged as such by other members of the household. The head is normally the eldest member, the main income earner, the owner-occupier of the house or the person who manages the affairs of the household. For households comprising a group of unrelated persons, the head of household refers to the person who manages the affairs of the household or any responsible person who supplied the information pertaining to the other household members.

Highest Qualification Attained

This refers to the highest grade/level or qualification (e.g. degree, diploma, certificate) that the person has acquired, whether by full-time or part-time study. Educational attainment is classified according to the Brunei Darussalam Standard Education Classification (BDSEC) 2011.

Household

A household is composed of a single person or a group of persons living together in the same house and making common provisions for food and other essentials of living. This group of persons may not necessarily be related to each other. Persons living in the same house but having their own food arrangements are not considered as members of the same household.

Household Consumption Expenditure

Household consumption expenditure refers to all expenditures, whether in cash or in-kind, made by the household or individual members on goods and services that are intended for consumption. It also includes the value of goods and services produced by the household for their own consumption. Thus, the imputed rent of owner-occupied housing is included as part of household consumption expenditure. The consumption expenditures made by domestic workers or maids, however, is excluded from the total household expenditure.

Non-consumption expenditures of the household are excluded, consisting of the following:

 (i) Transfers in the form of cash gifts, remittance and donations; zakat; contributions to provident/pension funds; taxes, fines and fees; repayment of loans (credit cards, car loans, housing loans, personal loans, real estate loans and other type of loans);

- (ii) Savings and investments such as purchase of land, house construction, purchase of house, major repairs and renovations, purchase of other capital goods, purchase of shares and stocks, loans to friends and relatives, bank deposits and other forms of savings; and
- (iii) Expenditures for household enterprises such as purchase of raw materials, supplies and materials, rental of business premises, payment to workers/helpers and other expenditures for household enterprises.

Household Disposable Income

Household disposable income comprises the current income of the households from production plus property and transfer receipts (such as interest, dividends, and social benefits) minus payments (such as transfer and interest payments).

Household Durables

Household durables are goods purchased that are meant for long-term use and are intended to sustain daily or regular usage for several years before replacement of such goods is required. Household durables include those items with a life expectancy of one year or more, such as transport and communication equipment, audio-visual equipment, electrical household appliances, and furniture and fixtures.

Household Income

Household income consists of regular receipts, both in cash and in-kind, accruing to members of the household before compulsory deductions. The monthly household income refers to the average income received per month by all household members from all sources. It also includes the imputed rent of owner-occupied housing. However, the income of domestic workers or maids is excluded from the total household income.

Excluded from household income are non-regular or non-recurring receipts such as:

- (i) withdrawals from savings
- (ii) money derived from sale of fixed assets (e.g. building or land)
- (iii) loans obtained
- (iv) repayment of loans by other households
- (v) lump sum cash receipts such as inheritances

Household Savings

Household disposable income comprises the current income of the households from production plus property and transfer receipts (such as interest, dividends, and social benefits) minus payments (such as transfer and interest payments).

Household Size

The household size is the total number of members in the household, including domestic workers or maids.

Income Deciles

Income deciles refer to the household income groups where the households are ranked in ascending order according to their incomes and then divided into **ten equal groups**. Each group comprises 10 per cent of the households. The first decile consists of households with income one-tenth way from the bottom, while the tenth decile consists of households with income one-tenth way from the top.

Income Quintiles

Income quintiles refer to the household income groups where the households are ranked in ascending order according to their incomes and then divided into **five equal groups**. Each group comprises 20 per cent of the households.

Mean, Median, Mode

An average is a value that is typical, or representative, of a set of data. Since such typical values tend to lie centrally within a set of data arranged according to magnitude, averages are also called measures of central tendency.

Mean, median and mode are some of the common averaging methods. Each has advantages and disadvantages, depending on the data and the intended purpose.

Suppose that we have a dataset consisting of eight values: 1,2,2,2,3,3,4,5

The **mean (commonly referred to as average)** is computed by adding those numbers and then dividing them with the number of occurrences.

Thusly, in this case the mean is:

$$mean = \frac{1+2+2+2+3+3+4+5}{7} = 2.75$$

The **median** of a set of numbers arranged in order of magnitude is either the middle value or the mean of the two middle values.

The numbers in the red circle are the middle numbers in the dataset. Since there are two numbers, therefore the median is the mean of the two numbers.

$$median = \frac{2+3}{2} = 2.5$$

The **mode** of a set of numbers is that value which occurs with the greatest frequency; that is, it is the most common value. The mode may not exist, and even if it does exist it may not be unique.

In the dataset given above, the number '2' occurred three times. In fact, the number '2' is the most occurring number in the dataset. Thus,

$$mode = 2$$

Symmetric distributions such as in the figure below, have its mean, median and mode approximately equal and therefore are approximately in the same position, which is on the centre of the distribution.

Number of Working Persons

This refers to the number of persons in the household who were working during the survey month, excluding domestic workers.

Occupation

The occupation of a working person refers to the kind of work performed in the place of employment during the survey month. Occupations have been classified according to the Brunei Darussalam Standard Occupational Classification (BDSOC) 2011.

Per Capita

Per capita means 'for each person' or 'per person'.

Respondent

The respondent is either the head of household or any member of the household who could provide the information sought in the survey.

Source of Income

Household income is made up of income from work, self-employment income, property income and transfer income.

(i) Employment Income

This includes employer and employee income but exclude self-employment income.

Employer income refers to the average receipts or profits a person earns from a business undertaking after deducting all operating expenses incurred such as purchases of materials and services, rent for premises or machineries, cost of repair of machineries and fixtures.

Employee income refers to the gross amount received per month before deductions for the Employees Trust Fund and loan repayment. It includes the basic wage or salary, overtime pay, allowances, tips, commissions as well as income in-kind provided by the employer, e.g. food, clothing and housing. It also includes one-twelfth of the annual bonus, and regular income received from secondary employment.

(ii) <u>Self-Employment Income</u>

Self-employment income is defined as the net income derived from self-employment in household enterprises, business, trade and professional activities.

(iii) Property Income

Property income refers to net receipts derived from ownership of assets and includes interests, dividends, rent of buildings, land, machinery and equipment, as well as the imputed rent of owner-occupied housing.

(iv) Transfer Income

Transfer income consists of pensions, allowances and assistances from government and private organisations. It also includes inter-household transfers such as alimony, child support, parental support and in-kind goods and services from social organisations.

Tenancy of Housing Unit

Tenancy of housing unit refers to the manner by which a housing unit is held by the occupants, whether owner-occupied, rented, provided free by employer, provided by employer with rental and other forms of tenancy.

(i) Owner-occupied

This means that the house is owned by either the head or other members of the household occupying that housing unit.

(ii) Rented

This means that the occupants of the house pay rent to the owner of that housing unit.

(iii) Provided by Government

This means that the house is provided by the Government to the head or other members of the household occupying that housing unit.

(iv) Provided by employer

This means that the housing unit is provided by the employer, whether government or private, to the head or other members of the household occupying that housing unit. The housing unit could be provided for free or with rental by the employer.

Types of Goods and Services

The types of goods and services for the household consumption expenditure is categorised according to the Brunei Darussalam Standard Classification of Individual Consumption (BDCOICOP) 2015. This is based on the Classification of Individual Consumption According to Purpose (COICOP) developed by the United Nations Statistics Division (UNSD), including an additional category for consumption expenditure abroad. The major divisions are:

- 1. Food and Non-alcoholic Beverages
- 2. Clothing and Footwear
- 3. Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels
- 4. Furnishings, Household Equipment and Routine Household Maintenance

- 5. Health
- 6. Transport
- 7. Communication
- 8. Recreation and Culture
- 9. Education
- 10. Restaurants and Hotels
- 11. Miscellaneous Goods and Services
- 12. Consumption Expenditure Abroad

Urban and Rural

Urban areas are defined as those areas which fall under the following categories:

- (i) Municipality areas of Bandar Seri Begawan, Kuala Belait, Seria, Pekan Tutong and Pekan Bangar; and
- (ii) Heavily populated areas with urban characteristics and dependent on the town for employment, education, entertainment and other facilities.

Those areas which do not satisfy the above criteria are considered as rural.
